This award certificate is designed perfectly for the creative and process driven work we do with our early stages Creative Drama classes here at Centre Stage – and we are very pleased to include this in our years work. As we have many classes at Centre Stage we are delighted that Trinity College has been able to accommodate us for the *May/June* assessment.

How The Assessment Works

Students are assessed together with their class at Centre Stage - The Teacher is in the room with the students, as they would normally be during class time, leading some areas and side coaching others. Their involvement reduces as the classes move from Bronze through to Gold Award. This assessment does not necessarily take place on their normal day or class time – dates and times to be supplied by Trinity. Assessment times will be confirmed as soon as possible, by Trinity, once all applications are in.

On The Day

Each child takes part in their normal drama activities and a 'practiced' bringing to life of a story they have been working on in class. Each child receives a sticker on the day from the examiner assessing it. Then later, children are awarded an individual named certificate from Trinity College London to acknowledge their achievement.

Preparation

At Centre Stage, during our weekly 'Creative Drama' classes we use dramatic play throughout the sessions, as we explore and bring to life, stories, characters and situations. These are the areas that Trinity are looking to assess - the 'process', in this informal assessment. We are able to practice and prepare as we would normally do. There may be a small amount of learning to be done outside of class, but no more than we would usually ask for in preparation towards our informal third term class presentations.

Why This Assessment?

In our view, this assessment is perfectly pitched for this age group and is in line with many of the beliefs Centre Stage hold with regard to the arts, education and child development. This informal setting is ideal for every child to shine, whilst enjoying the familiar process of a regular class. The children will feel more at ease, confident and supported with their teacher and friends in the room, whilst having fun and being assessed by a 'guest visitor' on what they do regularly in their weekly classes - bringing to life a story through drama and movement.

For us, here at Centre Stage, this is the joy of this assessment, as it combines what we do every day, alongside an informal assessment in a supportive, fun, positive and unthreatening environment.

This also provides an opportunity to acknowledge and recognise achievements, which is great for everyone involved.
