

## Character Profile Worksheet Background for a character you are playing in a monologue, scene or play

Ask yourself the following questions to help you work out what your character is like. Look for clues in the text, either in your own dialogue, or others comments about you. Look at your own actions and behaviour or others behaviour and actions towards you. If you can't find answers to these questions in the text, make up suitable answers that you think fit your characters personality.

Have you any family members? – ( brothers, sisters, parents names and ages)
What is your relationship like towards your family members?
What is your relationship like towards the characters in your scene/monologue?
If you are an adult – any spouse/partner or ex?

What are your hobbies?
What is your favourite music/band, and why? What is your favourite book, and why? What is your favourite film and why? What are your favourite clothes?
Any Pets?
What are your worries?
What are you good at?
